# Construction of new park and recreation facility underway

The construction of Rancho San Ramon Community Park and Amador Rancho Center is underway and completion is expected in summer 2014. The new park includes a lighted softball/baseball field and batting cage, lighted synthetic turf soccer/lacrosse fields, a small amphitheater, picnic areas, lighted tennis courts, playgrounds, a 'splashpad', and a 10,000 square foot multi-purpose facility. The new facility is being constructed by Shapell Homes as a part of their park and recreation dedication requirement in the Dougherty Valley. This state of the art facility will provide additional recreational amenities for local youth sports programs and the San Ramon community.

# New Street Smarts Banners Highlight Traffic Safety



Street Smarts, a traffic safety education program that serves the San Ramon Valley, recently unveiled new traffic safety banners throughout San Ramon. The banners feature advertisements that were created by local high school students as part of "It Happens," the high school component of the Street Smarts Program. The banner campaign features three distinct ads, including two that were created by California High School students Megan Williams and Calvin Smith. Megan created the ad that promotes skateboarding, and she is also the skateboarder featured in the ad. Calvin's ad, which highlights the dangers of texting and driving, was hand drawn by Calvin himself. The third ad promotes carpooling, and it was created by and features Michael Ha of Monte Vista High

School. Look for these ads on street light poles in Dougherty Valley, along Bollinger Canyon Road, and along Crow Canyon Road. The banners will be displayed throughout the year, reminding drivers to stay safe and to consider commute alternatives.

## Please Don't Leave Garbage Carts in the Street

Please set your garbage, recycling, and green waste carts out at the curb no earlier than the night before collection and remove them as soon as possible after collection. This will assist with street sweeping and your neighbors will appreciate it. Storing your carts at the curb is a violation of Article B6-22 of the San Ramon Municipal Code. Thank you for your cooperation.

# Summer Spare the Air

During the summer months, ozone pollution can become a health problem in the Bay Area. The summertime Spare the Air program notifies residents when air quality is forecast to be unhealthy, and urges residents to drive less and

reduce their emissions of ozone-forming pollutants.

In the Bay Area, the Spare the Air season generally runs from May through mid-October when clear skies, hot temperatures, lighter than usual winds, and strong temperature inversions combine to create smoggy conditions. Spare the Air alerts are declared for days forecast to have ozone concentrations high enough to



exceed federal health-based standards.

On these days, residents are urged to cut back on any activities that cause pollution such as driving, using gasoline-powered lawn mowers, oil-based paints, or household aerosol

products. People who are sensitive to unhealthy air are advised to limit their time outdoors, particularly in the afternoon hours.

# Recycling for Businesses and Apartments

State law requires all businesses that subscribe to four or more cubic yards of garbage service per week to implement a recycling program. San Ramon businesses can select the recycler of their choice. The City's website provides an up-to-date list of private commercial recycling service providers at <a href="https://www.sanramon.ca.gov/biz-recycle.htm">www.sanramon.ca.gov/biz-recycle.htm</a>. Even if your business has to pay for recycling

services, you may be able to reduce your overall cost by decreasing your garbage service. For assistance starting or expanding your recycling program at work, please contact David Krueger, Public Services at (925) 973-2824 or <a href="mailto:drueger@sanramon.ca.gov">dkrueger@sanramon.ca.gov</a>.

State law also requires that apartment complexes with five or more units provide recycling services for their residents. Apartment and condominium complexes in San Ramon can receive recycling services from Waste Management at no additional charge. ## **Central Park Renovation Plans**

Landscape architect David Gates and Associates, who designed and developed San Ramon Central Park, has completed a new 10 year renovation Master Plan. The City has already completed some of the renovations including the playground and the participatory fountain.

The next phase, underway currently, is the replacement of trees in the

amphitheater to enhance the appearance and safety of this area. The trees originally planted – 'Poplar' trees- have been in decline due to their age. The design includes removing the remaining sixteen 'Poplar' trees and replacing the original trees with three different tree varieties. This will provide an attractive backdrop, ample shade, increased safety, and reduced maintenance for decades.

# Landscape Renovations

The City is continually renovating existing landscape throughout the Citywide Landscaping Zone. This zone is funded by San Ramon property owners (outside of the Dougherty Valley area). Renovations include removal and replacement of missing or unhealthy plant material. The City identified more than 25 locations along major arterial roadways throughout the Citywide Zone that will be completed over the next 5 years. Three locations on Alcosta Blvd. and two locations on San Ramon Valley Blvd. will be completed by the end of June 2014.

## How to Recycle Extra Cardboard



an Ramon residents who have more cardboard than will fit in their recycling carts can set the extra cardboard out loose next to their recycling carts on collection day. The cardboard must be cut down to fit in your recycling cart after it has been emptied. In order to collect the extra cardboard, the driver must empty your recycling cart, put the extra cardboard into the cart, and then empty the cart again using the truck's automated collection arm. If you often have more cardboard or other recyclables than will fit in your recycling cart you can order a larger recycling cart (up to 96 gallons) from Waste Management at no additional charge by calling 925-837-3356.

# Street Smarts Brings Back the CHP "Start Smart" Program for Teen Drivers


Did you know that motor vehicle collisions are the number one killer of teenagers aged 15-19 in California? To help educate our teen drivers, Street Smarts has partnered with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) to bring the "Start Smart" program to the San Ramon Valley. "Start Smart" is a two-hour driver safety education class given by the CHP to new and future teenage drivers and their parents. Street Smarts hosted its first event in November at the Monte Vista High School Theater. The event drew over 175 attendees, and parent feedback was overwhelmingly positive. This spring, Street Smarts is hosting another "Start Smart" presentation on April 2, from 7 pm-9 pm, at the Dougherty Valley Performing Arts Center. CHP officers will discuss collision factors associated with teen drivers. collision avoidance techniques,



and driver/parent responsibilities. Parent and child attendance is strongly recommended. (Note: The presentation contains extremely graphic images.)

# Litter Travels But It Can Stop With You!

Disposable cups - food wrappers - plastic bags.... It's all trash that builds up on street corners, trails, highways, and in gutters, and parks. Litter is a problem that is everywhere.

Litter is a major cause of water pollution in the region. Trash travels down storm drains, polluting creeks, the Bay, and the ocean. Trash degrades water quality and adversely affects fish, wildlife, and aquatic habitats. The Clean Water Act Permit issued in 2009 to municipalities in five Bay Area counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Solano) requires cities to take actions to eliminate trash in stormwater runoff by 2022.

The City of San Ramon routinely strides to reduce litter through frequent street sweeping, cleanup of litter hot spots, litter removal along arterial streets, and cleaning of the storm drain inlets. Litter is a preventable source of pollution. Do your part to help prevent litter. While most people don't litter intentionally, it's important to prevent accidental littering. Simple steps such as using trash bags in cars, properly closing lids on trash and recycling bins, and picking up litter are great ways to help.
