In San Ramon, there will be an energizer station located along the Iron Horse Trail and Bollinger Canyon Road.

Drive Less Commuter Incentive

■ 511 Contra Costa offers a \$50 incentive to qualifying commuters who walk, bike, carpool, or use transit.



Vanpool Incentive Programs

- New qualifying vanpool passengers receive 50% off their vanpool cost for the first three months.
- Drivers who start a new vanpool and keep it on the road for at least one year could be eligible to receive a \$1,000 cash bonus.

DVC San Ramon Campus Student Transit Ticket Program

■ Registered students are eligible to receive one 12-ride County Connection transit ticket.

Remember.....the Transit Center is located on Executive Parkway, and the Bark and Ride Lot is located on 1120 South Wedgewood Road. These Park & Ride lots provide parking, so you can meet your carpool, vanpool, or take transit. County Connection bus routes can take you to the nearest BART station.

Your Input is Needed!

The City of San Ramon is seeking input from the community on conceptual designs for Bicycle/Pedestrian Overcrossings along the



Iron Horse Trail at Bollinger Canyon Road and Crow Canyon Road. The proposed bicycle and pedestrian overcrossings will

enhance safety and reduce delays for both trail and roadway users alike.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The San Ramon Valley Iron Horse Trail Bicycle Pedestrian Overcrossing Project is separated into four phases.

Phase I – the Corridor Concept Plan, has been completed, and included input from the City of San Ramon, East Bay Regional Park District, Contra Costa County, Town of Danville, and Contra Costa Transportation Authority. Phase I evaluated the feasibility of constructing overcrossings to improve access and safety for bicyclists and pedestrians and evaluated bridge concepts, feasibility, and potential costs.

Phase II - is a collaborative effort between San Ramon, Contra Costa County, and the East Bay Regional Park District, which owns and maintains the trail. This phase is funded by Measure J, the Contra Costa half cent sales tax approved by voters in 2004. Phase II includes a number of public outreach and design activities.

Phase III - Environmental Analysis - The City has secured a grant to complete the Environmental Analysis for the Project and it is expected to begin Summer 2015

Phase IV and Phase V (final design and construction) is anticipated to take place following environmental approval and pending grant funding.

Public Services Department Prepares Park and Fields for Summer Use

During the summer months, park and facility use increases as people get out and enjoy the warm weather. Public Services Department staff prepare for the summer season beginning in late winter. Special projects are completed to enhance the appearance and safety of park sites.



Winter/spring preparation tasks, include but are not limited to:

- Sod replacement
- Soccer and baseball field maintenance
- Irrigation valve repair and replacement
- Scoreboard and sport lighting repair and replacement
- Dive stand refinishing/ replacement at the pools
- Pool pump/motor repairs, if needed

Completing these tasks early gives the turf time to grow, and allows special projects to be completed in the



off-season, in order for all parks and facilities to be in excellent condition.

City staff are also scheduled to work weekends during the busy season (March-October) to meet the needs of the increased patronage. Weekend staff visits all major parks and facilities one or more times a day, depending on the level of activity.

1. Start Composting at Home Today!

2. Food Scrap Recycling





Close the loop on food scraps and food-soiled paper. Add them to the yard trimmings in your green waste cart to become soil-enriching compost.

Call Valley Waste Management Customer Service at (925) 837-3356. Printed on recycled paper.



Collect food scraps and food-soiled paper in a leak-proof container. Call WM for a free food pail.

Line container with paper towel, paper bags or newspaper for easy disposal and clean up.

Empty your food scraps in your green waste cart on your scheduled service day for collection.

No plastic bags or polystyrene foam, plastic, metal or glass.

Summer Spare The Air

During the summer months, ozone pollution can become a health problem in the Bay Area. The summertime Spare the Air program notifies residents when air quality is forecast to be unhealthy, and urges residents to drive less and reduce their emissions of ozone-forming pollutants.

In the Bay Area, the summer Spare the Air season generally runs from May through mid-October when clear skies, hot temperatures, lighter than usual winds and strong temperature inversions combine to create smoggy conditions. Spare the Air alerts are declared for days forecast to have ozone



concentrations high enough to exceed federal health-based standards.

On these Spare the Air days, residents are urged to cut back on activities that cause pollution such as driving, using oil-based paints, gasoline-powered lawn mowers, or household aerosol products like hair sprays. People who are sensitive to unhealthy air are advised to limit their time outdoors, particularly in the afternoon hours.
