New City Hall Construction is Underway

Construction for San Ramon's new City Hall is underway at Central Park off Bollinger Canyon Road. Construction started with site preparations in August and has proceeded diligently with site grading, underground utilities, foundation construction and steel framing. The structure began in late November with the steel frame scheduled to take final shape at the end of December.



City Hall will be a two story building, 44,300 square feet in area and will be the offices for the City Council, City Management, City Attorney, Administrative Services, Parks and Community Services and the City Council Chambers.

Construction is projected to be completed in early 2016 so watch for grand opening announcements late next year.

Cut tree into lengths that will easily fit into cart and allow lid to completely close. Place tree pieces into cart any time after holidays.


3. Special One-Time Tree Pickup Week of January 5, 2015

Set tree out on the curb for pickup by a special truck. Cut larger trees into lengths of 6 feet or less.

Extra Holiday Garbage? Bag it!

If you have more garbage than will fit in your garbage cart, you can purchase "Bag-It" bags from the City. Place your extra garbage in the Bag-It bags, tie them off, and set them out on the curb next to your garbage cart on collection day. The \$7.00 each price of the specially-marked Bag-It bags includes the cost of the extra pick-up. Extra garbage that is set out beside your garbage cart in regular garbage bags will not be picked up. You can purchase Bag-It bags from the City of San Ramon offices, 2226 Camino Ramon, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Holiday Garbage Collection Schedule

There is no garbage, recycling or green waste pick-up on Christmas Day or New Year's Day. If your service day falls on or after the holiday, your pick-up will occur one day late. For example, if your regular service day is Thursday, your Christmas week pick-up will be on Friday, December 26. If your regular service day is Friday, your Christmas week pick-up will be on Saturday, December 27.

Park & Facilities Projects

 \mathbf{A} s part of the City's preventative maintenance plan, the following projects have been completed or scheduled:

■ Central Park:

In September 2014, City staff installed four scoreboards on baseball fields 1-4, as part of the multi-year



Central Park Restoration Project.

■ San Ramon Olympic Pool:

The sand filters for the Lap Pool & Children's Pool were replaced to aid in maintaining the pool water clarity. Water from the pool is filtered through the sand, which traps organic and inorganic material and other particulate matter.

■ Shade Structures:

The San Ramon Sports Park, Old Ranch Park, and Bark and Ride locations were selected as the first sites for installation of new shade structures. Vendors submitted design concepts, which were reviewed by the Parks Commission and City Council. The City will use \$80,000 of the proceeds from voter approved East Bay Regional Parks District Park Bond Measure WW to fund this project. The Commission will continue to evaluate park sites for replacing or adding shade structures over the next several years.

Construction will begin in mid-December, with full project completion by the end of March.

Richard Fahey Village Green and Old Ranch Playground Upgrades

he purpose of the ADA and Safety Regulations project is to retrofit playgrounds at various City parks, to provide access to playground facilities in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Consumer Products Safety Commission (CPSC) safety regulations. Past retrofits have been completed at Twin Creeks, Country Club, Walt Disney, Red Willow, Athan Downs, and Central Park.

The Richard Fahey Village Green and Old Ranch playgrounds have been scheduled for retrofit this year. The City will use \$200,000 of proceeds from the voter approved East Bay Regional Parks District Park Bond Measure WW to fund the cost of this project.

Neighborhood meetings were held on September 6, 2014 to get public input on the designs, budget, and project timeline. The designs were also presented to the Parks Commission for approval. Construction is anticipated to start in January 2015 and completed by April 2015.

he Winter Spare the Air program notifies residents when particulate matter levels are anticipated to be unhealthy. On these high pollution days, the Air District will issue a Winter Spare the Air Alert which prohibits wood burning throughout the Bay Area. From November 1 through the end of February, under the Air District's wood-burning regulation, when a Winter Spare the Air Alert has been called, burning wood, firelogs, pellets, or any other solid fuels in your fireplace, woodstove, or other wood-burning device is illegal.

Residents and businesses can call 1-877-4NO-BURN (1-877-466-2876) to check the Winter Spare the Air Alert status and to report wood smoke concerns in their area.

Residents can sign up to receive automatic phone alerts by calling 1-800-430-1515. Once you sign up, you will remain on the roster for subsequent Winter Spare the Air seasons.

Residents can also sign up for EnviroFlash AirAlerts to receive e-mail notification when Winter Spare the Air Alerts are issued. Once you sign up, you will remain on the roster for subsequent Winter Spare the Air seasons.

City Winter Preparations

Throughout the fall months, as part of the City's annual flood control/drainage winter preparations, City staff completed annual creek maintenance activities along Coyote Creek, Norris Creek, South San Ramon Creek, and sections of Oak Creek. In addition to clearing flood control channels and creeks, staff inspected and cleaned catch basin storm drain inlets to minimize clogging during heavy rains.

Public Services Department crews also performed the following winter preparation tasks:

- Clearing of obstructions in creek waterways
- Removal of large grasses and tulles



- Litter abatement
- Clearing vegetation from water quality control ponds, detention basins, and bioswales in the Dougherty Valley

Performing these services provides a clear passageway for winter rains, minimizing the potential for creek flooding while protecting wildlife.

Sandbag stations (including both sand and bags) have been staged at Central Park, Athan Downs and San Ramon Sports Park for San Ramon residents and businesses. More information is posted on the City website at www.sanramon.ca.gov/general/storm.htm. The sandbags are provided, however, you should come prepared with a shovel to fill the sandbags.

In addition, the Public Services Department has an Emergency Standby Team that is on call 24-7 that provides assistance throughout the year.

Holiday Safety Tips

Do your part to make the holidays a safe and happy time for everybody – except criminals!

If you are traveling:

- Get an automatic timer for your lights (interior and exterior).
- Ask a neighbor or friend to watch your home.
- Don't forget to have the mail and newspaper delivery stopped.
- Call the Police Department to request vacation home checks 973-2700.

If you are out for the evening:

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone is home.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.
- Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

If you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings.
- Park in well lighted areas.
- Remember to lock your vehicle and place all valuables out of sight.
- Take your keys out prior to entering the parking lot
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a debit or credit card.
- Remember to close your purse and carry it close to your body; men try to carry your wallet in the front pocket
- Teach children to go to a store clerk or security guard if they get separated.



Limerick Park Vandalism – Playground Replacement



On August 14, 2014, vandals set fire to the playground equipment at Limerick Park, completely destroying the majority of the structure and contaminating the fibar playground cover. The incident was documented by the San Ramon Police Department.

City staff immediately obtained a quote from our playground vendor, for removal of the damaged equipment, and furnishing and installing new equipment. City staff worked with our playground contractor and all of the equipment was replaced on October 6, 2014. The playground has since been re-opened.

San Ramon Government 101 is BACK!

Leaf Season is Upon Us

Keeping San Ramon's streets clean is a big job for the street sweepers, and never more so than in the fall and winter months when trees shed their leaves. Street sweepers provide for the removal of naturally occurring dirt and leaf accumulation to promote efficient drainage and avoid accumulation of water. Large concentrated piles of yard waste cause the sweeper to clog and break down which interrupts the sweeping schedule. Also, leaves collected and piled in gutters can hide larger objects such as rocks, large twigs, and bricks that damage sweepers. As a result, sweepers bypass large mounds of debris.

Sweeper operators sweep residential areas twice a month and arterial roadways once a week. Leaves

on your property should be placed in the appropriate green waste container for pick-up or be used for composting. Please do not blow or sweep leaves into the gutter line which can block the flow of water and cause drainage issues. Remember that raking leaves into the street is considered illegal dumping.
