Participant Profile

When you register you will be asked for additional information including parent/legal guardians (names, phone numbers and email address), authorized adults who can pick-up and sign out your child (names, relationships, and cell phone numbers), allergy information, medical information, and requests for special accommodations. To expedite the registration process please complete the Participant Profile (located on page 38) either online or with your Registration Form. If you are registering in person, by fax, mail or drop-off, please include this participant profile form with your registration form. Your registration will not be processed unless the Participant Profile is included with the Registration Form and payment.

If you are registering online, for your convenience you will be prompted during the registration process to provide the participant profile information online.

Drop-Off/Pick-Up Policy

To protect the safety of all of our program participants, parents and staff, we ask that you please abide by the following child pick-up/drop-off guidelines.

1. Children **MUST** be signed in no earlier than 10 minutes prior to the start of the program and signed out no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of camp every day by a parent, legal guardian, or a person authorized to pick-up the child.
2. All parents and legal guardians must show a photo I.D. to sign children out at the end of the day. If someone else will be picking up your child, they **MUST** be designated by you as authorized on your participant profile and they will need to show a photo I.D. If an individual is not listed as authorized for pick-up our staff will not allow the child to leave camp.
3. For children who are signed in/out outside of the 10 minute grace period, there will be a \$1 fee charged per minute. Payment will be required at the time of drop-off and/or pick-up.
