# City Parks Projects

This winter, Public Services staff have been busy replacing old parks amenities such as picnic tables, benches, barbeques, and garbage cans as well as installing electric hand dryers in many park restrooms. All amenities are replaced under the Citywide Parks Amenities Renovation and Improvements Project, and funded by the Parks Development Fund. Each year, staff determines which parks will need to replace worn out amenities throughout each park. This past year, one of the priorities has been replacing old wooden picnic tables at Red Willow Park, Mill Creek Hollow, and Richard Fahey Village Green, and replacing them with much more durable concrete tables that will hold up better to weather and vandalism. Another priority has been to replace paper towel dispensers in the park restrooms with electric hand dryers. This will reduce yearly expenses purchasing paper towels, provide a better sanitized environment for park patrons and reduce vandalism in the park restrooms that involve



paper towel dispensers. Staff will continue to install new amenities throughout the parks in the upcoming months, and this process will continue each year to assure the parks are safe and ready to be enjoyed by all park users.

# Pavement Management 2021 Project

The Pavement Management Program (PMP) was developed as part of a Citywide Program to provide street maintenance on an annual basis. By performing this maintenance frequently and systematically, the City minimizes higher, long-term maintenance costs and maintains a higher quality throughout the life of the pavement. The scope of work for the annual PMP is based on certain factors that include street type (arterial/ collector/residential), condition of the street and overall network, the conditions of the streets within a neighborhood or area, and the funds available.

The Pavement Management 2021 Project, Capital Improvement Project (CIP) 000003, is expected to take place between September and November 2021 in the area shown on the vicinity map. The Project is mainly focused on pavement treatments that will cover approximately 12 miles of streets.

There will be several phases of work, including: ADA curb ramp upgrades (approximately 126), concrete curb, gutter, and sidewalk repairs; pavement crack sealing; pavement surface treatment; and pavement striping and markings.

## San Ramon Valley Street Smarts Bike Safety Message

A bike ride is a great way to get exercise and fresh air, but remember to follow safety measures and road rules. Here are some helpful tips from San Ramon Valley Street Smarts:

- ✓ Wear a properly fitted helmet
- ✓ Ride with the flow of traffic
- ✓ Slow down and yield (give up your right-of-way) to pedestrians
- ✓ Stop and look left, right, and left again, before crossing the street

- Don't wear headphones or ear buds while riding
- ✓ Wear bright clothing or reflective gear
- ✓ Use directional hand signals

- ✓ When riding as a group, ride single file, with one bike length between each bike
- ✓ Ring your bicycle bell before passing on the left
- Cross at marked crosswalks and walk your bike across the crosswalk

### City Seeks Input on the General Plan Housing Element Update

San Ramon has begun the process of updating the Housing Element of the City's General Plan to ensure the City is prepared to meet the future housing needs for the community. We need your input to:

- Identify where and how to place 5,111 housing units for very-low, low, moderate, and above moderate-income categories.
- Types of housing ranging from apartments, condominiums, townhomes, to single-family homes.
- Develop Housing Element goals and policies for the City to implement to address a number of important housing-related issues.

Under State law, every city and county is required to update its Housing Element to address specific requirements and submit the updated Housing Element to the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD).

While the update is not due to HCD until January 2023, addressing this challenge will require a significant amount of input and feedback from the San Ramon Community. We are starting this process early, so every community member has the opportunity to participate.

### San Ramon Citizen's Planning Academy Returns!!

The San Ramon Community Development Department anticipates hosting the fourth session of San Ramon Citizen's Planning Academy in the fall of 2021. The goal of the Academy is to educate and engage residents in the City's planning process. The Academy will provide an overview of why cities plan, how

planning shapes our community, and the land use planning process. The classes are anticipated to be held on five consecutive Mondays beginning September 13<sup>th</sup>, from 6:30 to 9:00 pm, including one Saturday tour, and will be dependent on COVID-19 Health Order restrictions in place at the time. The class is free, but space is limited

to 20 residents, over 18 years of age. # Crow Canyon Road Widening Project - Alcosta Boulevard to St. George Road - Construction Begins Fall 2021

The City is beginning construction of the Crow Canyon Road Widening Project. The Project will construct one additional driving lane in each direction of Crow Canyon Road, between Alcosta Boulevard and St. George Road.

In addition to the new lanes, the work includes improved facilities for pedestrians, such as sections of new sidewalk, ADA upgrades, crosswalk consolidation, and a spacious walking path. Wide green bike lanes will be installed throughout the project to provide additional delineation between vehicles and cyclists. New vibrant and drought-tolerant landscaping will be installed to enhance the roadway features. Updated traffic signals and streetlights, with the latest equipment and technology will replace the existing older traffic signals and lighting. The existing lanes will be repaved at

the same time as the widening to provide a new, smooth, and durable roadway. A rendering of the expected appearance of the completed project is shown above.

Currently, the project is under preconstruction utility relocation work. This work is expected to continue through summer 2021 with the road widening construction following in fall 2021. Project completion is anticipated by the end of 2022. During construction, there will be significant disruption to traffic, with lane closures and expected traffic delays. A construction speed limit will be in effect and enforced. Residents, commuters, and businesses will be encouraged to use alternate routes such as Bollinger Canyon Road to avoid construction impacts and minimize delays.

# San Ramon Olympic Pool and Aquatic Park Renovation!

he Public Works Department has been working diligently to renovate the San Ramon Olympic Pool and Aquatic Park. Phase I of the renovation began in June 2020 and included: the replacement of the Children's Play Pool Play Structure; installation of a safety fence around the Lap Pool; replaster of the Children's Play Pool and the 50 Meter Pool; demolition of the slide: and the demolition and reinstallation of the cantilever deck. The play structure and slide were 20 years old. Parts for the Children's Play Pool structure were






hard to find, and parts for the slide were no longer available. The replastering of the City's pools is completed every 10 years unless an issue arises, and it begins to deteriorate faster than anticipated. Both the Children's Play Pool and 50 Meter Pool had reached year 10 of the plaster's life cycle. Phase II of the renovation addresses the needs of the facility and will include: new flooring, paint, locker rooms, lighting, and updated restrooms. Phase II is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2021. # Citywide Bicycle Network Improvements

Whether it is for health and exercise, a form of leisure time together with friends and family, or commuting, bicycling has increased in the past year and the improvements to the City's bicycle network has never been more relevant. The City is focused on infrastructure improvements, building a safe, connected, and robust bicycle network as evidenced by the adoption of the City's first Bicycle Master Plan in September 2018.

Did you know that since the adoption of the Bicycle Master Plan, the City has installed 110,700 feet of bicycle infrastructure improvements? That is 21 miles of improvements such as new bicycle lanes, buffered bike lanes, green colored pavement markings in vehicle-bicycle conflict zones, a bike box, and "Share the Road" markings (sharrows).



This year, the City will improve the bicycle network by adding approximately 142,000 feet, or approximately 27 miles, of improvements that include sharrow markings, buffers adjacent to existing bike lanes, and green conflict zones on intersection and major driveway approaches.

Bicycling is a green, viable form of transportation around the City.

# Alcosta Boulevard Pavement Rehabilitation Project


he Alcosta Boulevard Pavement Rehabilitation Project will provide much needed improvements to the pavement along Alcosta Boulevard between Veracruz Drive and Olympia Fields Drive. The Project is expected to take place between August and October 2021.

The total project cost is approximately \$5.0M. The City will receive \$1,176,000 in Federal Funds through One Bay Area Grant 2 (OBAG2) to assist in completing the project.

Various pavement treatments will be used to improve the pavement and will be applied at different street sections. The Project also includes ADA curb ramp upgrades between Veracruz Drive and Olympia Fields Drive; and crack sealing where microsurfacing is applied.

Construction of this Project will result in major traffic disruption within the limits of the Project. In order to minimize the duration that residents are impacted, City staff is working on guidelines for a detour plan that will allow the construction to take the minimum amount of time. Once the detour plan is complete by early summer 2021, staff will provide additional information via social media, public announcements, and mailings.
