


DRIVER LICENSE RENEWAL

CA Department of Motor Vehicles

The DMV provided an automatic (one-year) extension to Californians age 70 and older with a noncommercial driver license with an expiration date between March 1st and December 31st, 2020. This action delays the requirement for this population to visit a DMV office during the COVID-19 pandemic.



The DMV previously provided 120-day extensions to senior drivers with (non-commercial) licenses expiring in March through July. While the new extensions are automatic, drivers will not receive a new card or paper extension in the mail. As an option, drivers can request a free temporary paper extension online beginning July 15 through DMV's Virtual Field Office to document the extension, though it is not needed to drive. Californians with a suspended license are not eligible.

Before You Begin

Renew online using the [Driver License Renewal application](#) if you have already received your renewal notice.

Have your driver license card available.

Expiration of driver license must be between 03/1/2020 and 07/31/2020 (before 09/30/2020 for commercial license) for customers 69 years old and younger OR before 12/31/20 (09/30/2020 for commercial license) for customers 70 years old or older.

Required fields to be completed: name, date of birth, email address, and phone number.

Note: If your driving privilege is currently suspended or you have lost your driver license, do not use this application.
