I have a solid record of experience and action. As the senior member of the city council, I served as Mayor, Vice Mayor four times and on the original Charter City Commission. Represented you on open space committees, local and regional transportation authorities, and school volunteer and support groups.

My Experience as Mayor

On 9/11/2001, I received one of those emergency telephone calls that all mayors dread. I rushed over to city hall and met with the City Manager and Police Chief concerning San Ramon residents and the events unfolding in New York City. We watched the attack on the Twin Towers and learned of the heroism on UAL Flight 93. It was my responsibility to protect San Ramon families from an overly aggressive news media and others who wanted to draw attention where it did not belong. That day I learned about overcoming limitations and who performs in a real emergency.

Challenging Times

Today with the Corona virus, social lockdowns, and protest marches; we need to ask ourselves, "Who is most likely to provide leadership in these challenging times?" Fundamentally; how is the city going to balance the budget while maintaining basic city services including police and fire to protect our homes and families?

Practical Experience

I was an early advocate for San Ramon to have its' own police department (2007) and police chief. I continue to support prudent fiscal policies that enable us to achieve and maintain our AAA bond/credit rating. I was Chairman of the Contra Costa Transportation Authority when the state tried to take our money for the construction of the Caldecott Tunnel (fourth bore). I am most proud of the role I played in getting Dougherty Valley High School built six years early and Bella Vista Elementary School open (not in original plan).

Building Relationships

In California, cities have to compete for transportation money and essential services. My experience with the League of California Cities, East Bay Regional Park District, Bay Area Air Quality Management District, transportation boards and building public/private partnerships has taught me that success is often based on consensus building, embracing diversity and personal relationships.
