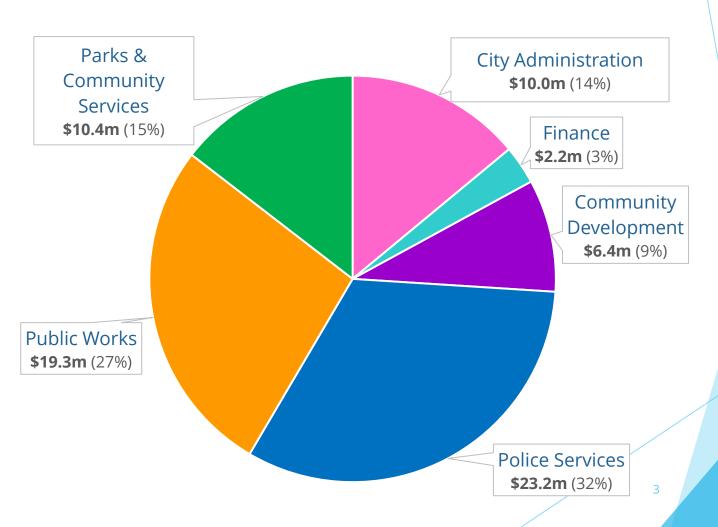

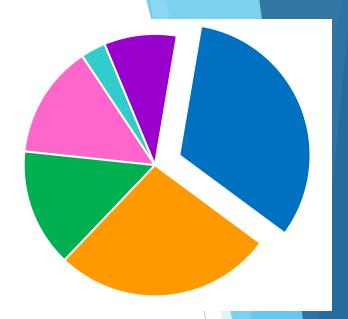

# Types of Expenditure Adjustments

- Non-Discretionary: No choice; contractually obligated (i.e., employment contracts, retirement benefits) \$6.8m
- Discretionary: Optional; operational efficiency \$1.9m
- Potential Savings: 4% or \$2.2m

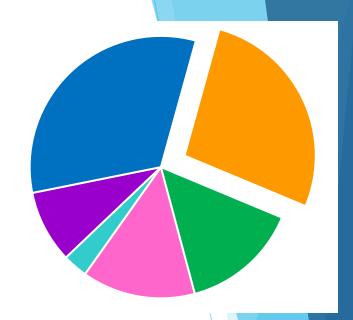
### Police Services \$23.2m (32% of GF)

- ▶ 12% increase from FY25 Mid-Year Budget
- Non-Discretionary: \$2.9m
- Discretionary: \$426k
- Potential Savings: (\$778k)



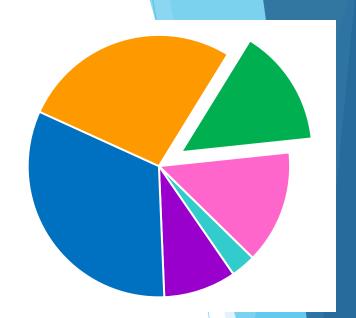
### Public Works \$19.3m (27% of GF)

- ▶ 3% increase from FY25 Mid-Year Budget
- Non-Discretionary: \$1.1m
- Discretionary: \$62k
- Potential Savings: (\$525k)



### Parks & Community Services \$10.4m (15% of GF)

- ► **16% increase** from FY25 Mid-Year Budget
- Non-Discretionary: \$1.7m
- Discretionary: \$9k
- Potential Savings: (\$342k)

## Measure N Transactions and Use Tax

- Ballot measure passed on Nov 5, 2024 with 56.2%
- ▶ 1% add-on for 10 years
- Effective April 1, 2025, San Ramon sales tax rate is 9.75%

### Measure N Projections

Date	Estimate	Change (\$)	Change (%)
August 2023	\$15.7m		
February 2025	\$14.8m	(\$900,000)	(5.7%)

- > FY25 sales tax estimate decreased \$800k
  - Adjusted out FY24 one-time payments
  - Adjusted out FY24 irregularly large payments
  - Adjusted out a FY25 audit correction
- Future uncertainties: tariffs, inflation, consumer confidence

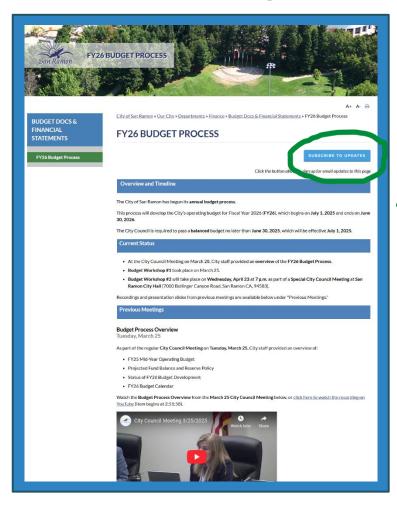
- Cover actual deficits incurred while working with Council and community to explore ongoing revenue enhancements or expenditure reductions
